Fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov. Delta's school code is 002251.

Michigan Community College Guarantee

If you graduated high school in 2023 or later, you may be eligible for:

- In-district tuition based on contact hours and mandatory fees for up to 3 years. For Delta students, 'in-district' means you reside in Bay, Midland or Saginaw Counties
- An additional, up to \$1,000, to assist with college costs for students eligible for a Federal Pell Grant

Michigan Reconnect

Michigan residents, age 25 and older, who have not yet completed a college degree, may be eligible for:

• In-district tuition based on contact hours and mandatory fees. Renewable each year. For Delta students, 'in-district' means you reside in Bay, Midland or Saginaw Counties (Out of district student are responsible for the difference)

Delta College Foundation Scholarships

Scholarships are available to current and future students. Last year, over \$1 million was awarded to 891 students. Application period for Fall 2025 is December 3, 2024 to February 4, 2025.

I. Apply to Delta College

Go to delta.edu/apply. Create an application account *(use personal email, not high school or parent)* and submit a new application based on your student type.

2. Determine Course Placement

Guided Self-placement Survey

This quick placement survey allows you more flexibility to select the math and English courses that best align with your academic pathway, experience and comfort level.

3. Delta Student Account Activation

Approximately four hours after receiving your acceptance email, you'll receive an email from **accounts@delta.edu** with instructions on setting up your Delta Student Account and multifactor authentication (MFA).

4. Complete Online Orientation

Once the admissions office has received notice that you've completed the above steps, you'll be sent an email to your application account email with instructions to self-register for online orientation and pre-advising.

5. Request Transcripts

High School: If you are a graduating high school senior, send your high school transcripts directly to admissions@delta.edu. Request through Parchment.com or your high school counselor.

College: If you attended another college or university, have your "OFFICIAL" transcripts sent to **registration@delta.edu**

Transcript evaluation may take 4-6 weeks.

6. Apply for Financial Aid

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will determine your eligibility for many federal and state grants, loans and scholarships such as Pell, Tuition Incentive Program (TIP) and many others.

Step 1: Create your federal Student Aid ID at **studentaid.gov**, by clicking create account.

Step 2: Fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Form. **Delta's school code is 002251.** Please allow 4-6 weeks for processing. 7. Connect with Your Student Success Advisor
