BOARD ACTION 4924

It is the recommendation of the Administration that the Board of Trustees approve revisions to Senate Policy 1.005, Mission.

Senate President, Eric Beckman, said that one of the goals of the Student Success Summit that was held on January 27, was to generate the creation of a meaningful and memorable mission statement for the College. A fourteen-member writing team created a draft statement and asked for input from the College community. The draft was revised based on the input of the College community. Enrollment Report

Registration for spring/summer semester began on March 13. As of today, 5,795 students are enrolled. Registration for fall semester began on March 27. So far, 5,564 students have enrolled.

Spring/Summer enrollment is at 35,181 credit hours, 92% of projections (38,150). Payment deadline is today, followed by about 3 more weeks of registration before the May 8 start date. After that, students can continue to register for the summer session.

As expected, with the improving economy and continued gains in local employment, we are not seeing the record enrollments of a few years ago. We continue to work hard to get every student considering college to make Delta their first choice.

Personnel Report

Dr. Goodnow congratulated the faculty members who have earned promotion and/or tenure, effective with the 2012 academic year. She said that she reviewed the packets for each of these individuals and is impressed by the quality of the faculty who earned promotion and/or tenure. Congratulations to Jeff VandeZande, Professor of English, who received SVSU's Stuart and Vernice Gross Award for excellence in writing by a Michigan author. The award is for his novel, *American Poet*.
